(Uncoated)
Magazines
All must be empty, clean, dry and free
of debris

WHAT TO COMPOST

Pumpkins
Fruit and vegetables
Meat (no bones)
Bread and crackers
Pasta
Dairy Products (Cheese, Yogurt,
No Liquids)
Coffee grounds
Egg shells



Jack-o-Lanterns

Whether whole or carved into jack-o-lanterns, pumpkins can be disposed of in your organic recycling or yard waste container. Unsure if you have an organic recycling or composting facility nearby? We'll help you find one.



Candy Wrappers

Candy wrappers may feel like plastic, but they aren't recyclable. Unwrapped candy can be disposed of with your organic recycling. Material smaller than a credit card cannot be recycled. Add these to your standard waste container.



Costumes

Fabric costumes and latex masks can be reused or donated, but not recycled. Donate old costumes to a local thrift store or use as a dress-up costume for kids.
