ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

Administrator Amidei reported the following:

- Tomorrow the village is holding their annual Joint Review Board meetings for the 4 Tax Increment Financing (TIF) Districts at 11:00. There will be an update on the activity and status of each TIF District presented.
- There was a kickoff working group meeting with the Library, the Park District, District 91 School District and the Community Center to coordinate focusing on community newsletters and coordinating a village-wide calendar. This will likely be a monthly meeting to strategize how we can work better together.
- Before the COVID-19 pandemic, the Chamber looked into the possibility of establishing Special Service Areas (SSA) along Madison Street and Harlem Avenue. This effort will be reinitiated in early August and will center on creating the SSA, which will be used for façade improvements, signs, advertising, streetscaping and other improvements in these business districts.
- In the spirit of promoting communication, the Administrator is looking closely at efforts that can be made to improve interactions with the public, via our website, newsletters, e-newsletters, which may save citizens trips to village hall and streamline processes, including stepping up eservices, expanding the use of our Facebook page and Constant Contact as well. These are some of the projects Administrator Amidei will be looking at in the short-term.

COMMISSIONER'S REPORTS:

Commissioner Byrnes reported that next weekend the Madison Street Sidewalk Sale, is happening as well as the National Ice Cream event at the Brown Cow, so Madison Street will be very busy. In addition, the Park District has the 16" Softball Tournament later this month.

Commissioner Nero remarked on the public comments received and stated that he appreciates the voice of the citizens as well as hearing what's happening in Forest Park. The commissioner applauds those submitting public comment and assured them that their voices are heard and understood. The

Commissioner further pointed out that in response to citizen inquiries, the village's flood assistance application is available on the website under the resources tab. Next, Commissioner Nero commented that, since the liquor serving hours were moved back to midnight, he has not heard about anything negative occurring. Since the Altenheim demolition project is nearing completion, the next steps for this Council should be planning the future use of the property. Further positive projects happening in the village are the street and sewer upgrades – all positively affecting the citizens. Last, the commissioner commented on the upgrades to the Public Works fleet. The department is salvaging some of their old equipment and reinvesting in new vehicles and equipment to better serve the residents.

Mayor Hoskins reported that District 91 Superintendent, Elizabeth Alvarez, has officially started in her position and there will be a back-to-school event on August 17th from 4-7:00 p.m. at the Middle School. Next the Park District reached out to the mayor requesting that the elected officials volunteer for the No-Gloves Tournament coming up later this month. Those wishing to volunteer were encouraged to contact Jackie Iovinelli. There has been a lot of activity at 7301 Roosevelt building. Director Glinke has gotten the property fenced in and there may be demolition of the building in the coming weeks. The Forest Park Arts Alliance is resuming their "Stoop Concerts" events. The mayor also reported that he has received word that the mass vaccination center on Roosevelt is likely to close soon, so those wishing to receive vaccines there, should do so right away. Last, on a somber note, former District 91 student, Miles Thompson, was a victim of gun violence in the Austin area. Residents were encouraged to keep his family in their thoughts during this difficult time.

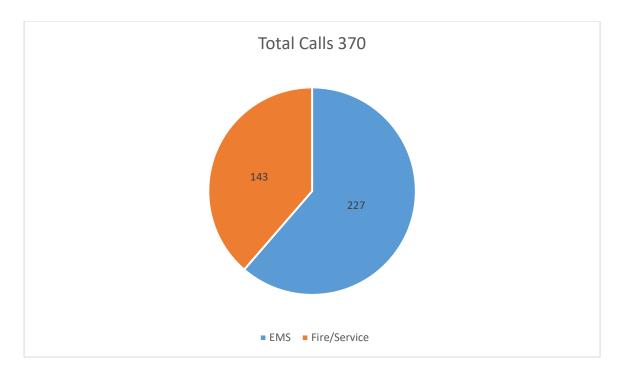

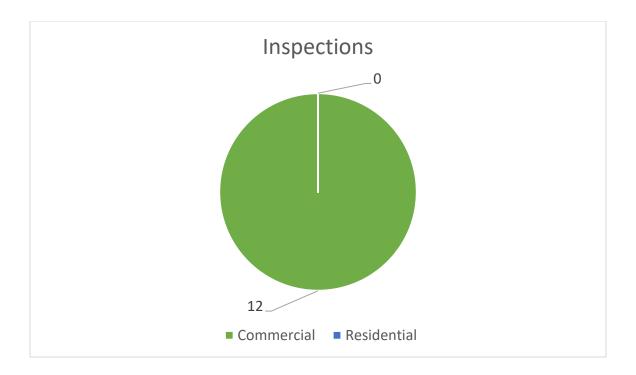

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Criminal Investigations Division

Detectives / Tactical Response Unit / Community Policing



May and June 2021

The Forest Park Police Department's (FPPD) Criminal Investigation Division (CID) is supervised by Lt. Pete Morrissette. Two detectives are assigned to CID; Det. Jarlath Heveran and Det. Joe Schick. Det. George Hickey reports to the Criminal Investigations Division and is assigned to work with a Drug Enforcement Administration (D.E.A.) Task Force. Det. Mike O'Connor is the police department's Community Policing / Crime Free Housing Officer. LaShan Riggins, the Forest Park Police Department's Evidence Custodian, is a member of CID and aside from her evidence custodian duties performs administrative duties for the investigators, and assists communications, parking, and records when needed. There is a counselor assigned to the department from Amita Health Behavioral Health Clinician. Our Police Crisis Services Worker is Evelyn Simmons. Evelyn is outsourced to the Forest Park Police Department four days a week and has office space within the CID building located at 501 DesPlaines Ave. Police incident reports are reviewed by the investigations division every working day. Incidents that have victims wishing to sign a complaint against an offender are assigned to a detective for further review in an effort to develop a suspect(s), conduct interviews, and gather evidence to effect an arrest and present a winnable case in criminal court. Some incidents are turned over to Evelyn Simmons should there be a need for outreach from her organization, mainly in reference to mental health concerns. Other incidents such as neighbor or landlord tenant disputes, are forwarded to Det. Mike O'Connor so he can intervene and possibly mediate or offer eviction advice. Problem properties may be deemed a nuisance by Det. O'Connor should they meet the criteria established under the village ordinance.

Detectives rotate on call assignments weekly so a Forest Park Police Detective is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week should the need for CID assistance arise. If a major incident is encountered during off hours, the entire CID staff could be called upon to respond if needed.

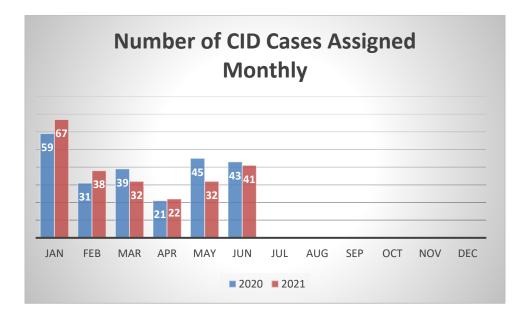
Detective O'Connor was present in CID for fifteen days in May and June 2021.

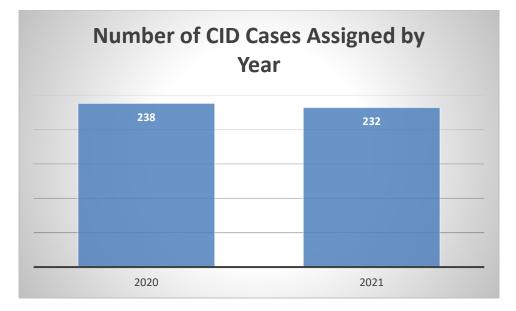
The detectives are members of the West Suburban Major Crimes Task Force (WESTAF) and are, at times, on call to assist member agencies should a homicide occur in a WESTAF jurisdiction. There were no external WESTAF callouts in May and June 2021.

Currently, the Forest Park PD is a member agency in the multijurisdictional West Suburban Drug and Gang Enforcement Task Force (WEDGE). Det. Schick and Det. O'Connor are assigned to assist WEDGE. WEDGE was active for one day in this reporting period. During this tour, Detective Schick assisted in a drug investigation and search warrant execution.

Manpower in CID was reduced during May and June 2021 by four weeks of collective vacation time taken, and by several days of training.

There were 73 incidents assigned to investigators for follow-up in May and June 2021, 32 in May and 41 in June. Case selection was reduced and screened due to a shortage of manpower as well as focus on an unusual number of major cases occurring recently.





Following is a summary of notable investigations in May and June 2021:

- Detective Schick investigated an aggravated domestic battery in which the offender stalked his estranged girlfriend and located her dining in a restaurant. The offender proceeded to attack and attempt to stab the victim. Detective Schick conducted electronically recorded interviews with involved persons, and also obtained a search warrant for the offender's social media page and phone to show how he was tracking the victim. The offender was charged with attempted murder and aggravated domestic battery.
- Detectives responded to assist patrol units with a violent domestic disturbance, and Detective Heveran recognized the suspect from past cases as well as an ongoing federal investigation. Detective Heveran documented the activity to forward to federal prosecutors as he found violations of the offender's federal bond conditions.
- Detective Schick responded to investigate a vehicular hijacking and kidnapping in which the offender took the victim's vehicle by force and also compelled her to remain in the vehicle with him as he drove to Chicago and attempted to use her debit and credit cards. Detective Schick obtained a large quantity of surveillance footage from locations throughout the western suburbs and in Chicago, and obtained search warrants for said footage when needed. Detective Schick also conducted electronically recorded interviews with the victim and offender, obtaining a confession of the crimes from the offender. The offender was charged with Aggravated Kidnapping and Vehicular Hijacking.
- Forest Park Police investigators are investigating a homicide that occurred in May 2021. The victim was walking on the sidewalk from the train station to Maywood when he was fatally stabbed by an offender with no apparent provocation or motive. Through tracking surveillance footage, investigators developed a suspect identity. Forensic evidence has been sent to the crime laboratory and investigators are awaiting results of that in order to present the case to the Cook County State's Attorney Office for review for criminal charges.

- Detectives Heveran and Schick were investigating garage burglaries in the area when they discovered a local person was selling burglary proceeds through a social media sales site. With the assistance of Maywood Police Department, they conducted an undercover purchase of a stolen bicycle, and took the offender in to custody. After also locating footage of the offender in the alley leaving the scene of a burglary, he was charged with Burglary.
- Detective Heveran has continued to investigate a homicide that occurred in March 2021, following up on numerous interviews and search warrants, and locating new witnesses to the incident in preparing a case against a known suspect. This case is expected to be reviewed by the Cook County State's Attorney Office for criminal charges in July 2021.
- Detective Schick investigated a complaint of a criminal sexual assault from 2020 in which the victim made a delayed allegation. Detective Schick obtained search warrants and subsequently evidence from the suspect's social media sites in which he discussed the incident. Detective Schick arranged a Victim Sensitive Interview with the juvenile complainant, and subsequently took the suspect in to custody. After a review of the case, felony charges of Criminal Sexual Assault were approved against the juvenile suspect. He was processed and taken to the Cook County Juvenile Detention Center.

Forest Park Criminal Investigations Division members are experienced and dedicated public servants who have built and continue to maintain professional relationships within the community and with neighboring agencies in an effort to quash criminal activity and to solve as many cases as possible.

RE: FY2022 Appropriation Ordinance for the July 26, 2021 agenda

Per Illinois Municipal Code (65 ILCS 5/8-2-9), the corporate authorities of municipalities with a population of less than 500,000 shall pass the annual appropriation ordinance within the first quarter of the fiscal year. The annual appropriation ordinance and estimate of revenues must be filed with the county clerk within 30 days of the adoption.

The FY2022 Appropriation Ordinance is attached for your review. The Appropriation Ordinance establishes the legal spending limits, however the annual line-item budget is the working document for all financial activities. General and Water fund salaries are appropriated with a 5% allowance for overages in overtime and retirements; operating expenditures are categorized with allowances ranging from 10-25% for unexpected maintenance and repairs, and a 30-50% allowance is provided for grants and capital expenses. The estimate of revenues mirrors the appropriations by fund and reflects a balanced operation. Included for FY2022 are restricted funds for Police DUI Enforcement, Police Vehicle Replacement, and Capital Asset for vehicles and equipment. These restricted funds will require Council approval prior to establishment.

Below is a brief overview of changes from the FY2021 document. Prior year appropriations were reduced due to the impact of COVID; current year operations reflect a return to full staffing and operations. Large variances from prior year are for capital assets or projects.

Section III. The appropriations herein for the payment of "Liabilities", "Contract Liabilities", or "Unpaid Bills," if any, shall not be construed as an approval of any such liabilities or unpaid bills, but shall be regarded only as an appropriation for the payment thereof, when and if they are found to be valid and legal obligations against the Village of Forest Park, and are appropriated, vouchered and audited.

Section IV. Any and all monies heretofore appropriated and not expended, which now remain in the Treasury of the Village of Forest Park, are hereby appropriated under the provisions of this Ordinance.

Section V. The appropriations made herein for salaries and wages for positions shall be regarded as maximum appropriations as to the sum appropriated, and the number of positions specified, and the length of time for which the incumbent of each position is to be employed. No employee shall have the right to demand continuous employment and compensation by reason of the appropriations, if it becomes necessary to discharge him or her on account of lack of work, or lack of funds. In case of any vacancy in any office or position herein appropriated for, the Head of the Department in which the vacancy occurs shall not be required to fill such office or position if, in his or her own judgment and discretion, there is no necessity thereof.

Section VI. All unexpended balances of any item of any appropriations made by this Ordinance may be expended by making good any insufficiency in any item or other appropriation made by this Ordinance.

Section VII. All Ordinances, or parts of Ordinances inconsistent or in conflict herewith, shall be, and the same are hereby repealed.

Section VIII. If any item, purpose, sentence or portion thereof of this Ordinance be for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion of this Ordinance, and that any Ordinance or parts of any Ordinance in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section IX. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

Issue Statement

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF ONE FULLY EQUIPPED 2022 INTERNATIONAL <u>HV 504 HEAVY DUTY PLOW TRUCK WITH BUILDOUT</u>

WHEREAS, the Village of Forest Park (the "Village"), a body politic and corporate, duly organized and existing as a municipal corporation of the State of Illinois, is authorized by the laws of the State of Illinois to purchase and acquire personal property for the benefit of the Village and its inhabitants and to enter into contracts with respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the corporate authorities of the Village deem it for the benefit of the Village and for the efficient and effective administration thereof that the Village purchase a one (1) fully equipped 2022 International HV 504 Heavy Duty Plow Truck with Buildout (the "Truck") for the public works department constituting personal property necessary for the Village to perform essential governmental functions; and

WHEREAS, the Village solicited proposals through Sourcewell Purchasing Cooperative ("Sourcewell") and received proposals for the purchase of the truck chassis from Rush Truck Center – Chicago ("Chassis Proposal") and the truck buildout from Lindco Equipment Sales ("Buildout Proposal"); and

WHEREAS, in the opinion of four-fifths of the corporate authorities of the Village, it is advisable, necessary and in the public interest that the Village waive the purchasing procedure prescribed in the Village Code and purchase the Truck through Sourcewell, pursuant to the Buildout Proposal in the amount of Eighty-Eight Thousand One Hundred Eighty-One and 00/100 Dollars (\$88,181.00) and the Chassis Proposal in the amount of One Hundred Twenty-Two Thousand Two Hundred Sixteen and 00/100 Dollars (\$122,216.00), collectively attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A (the "Proposals").

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Forest Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: That the facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

Section 2: That it is hereby determined that it is advisable, necessary and in the public interest that the Village of Forest Park waive the purchasing procedures prescribed in the Village

Section 3: That the officers and employees of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required by the parties to carry out, give effect to and consummate the transactions contemplated hereby and to take all action necessary in conformity therewith, including, without limitation, the execution and delivery of any closing and other documents required to be delivered in connection with the Proposals.

Section 4: That if any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 5: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage by fourfifths of all the commissioners holding office, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

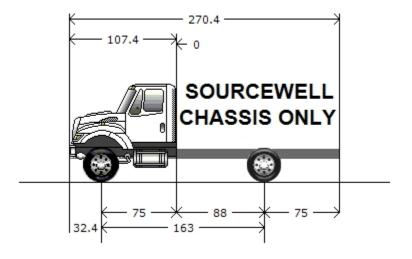

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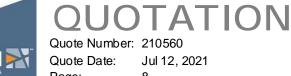

Issue Statement

Request for Village Council action related to the adoption of two resolutions concerning contracts/proposals pertaining to Village's September 11, 2021 Ribfest event.

Background

At the July 12, 2021 Village Council meeting, the Village Council approved a proposal from American Mobile Staging, Inc. related to our rental of a 24'x16'x4' superstage that will be used at the Village's September 11, 2021 Ribfest event.

In the Resolution that approved said proposal from American Mobile, language referenced their provision of "audio, lighting and generator equipment and technical support" services to the Village. Obviously, this is incorrect.

At today's meeting, an updated resolution is being presented to the Village Council for your consideration to reapprove said proposal from American Mobile Staging, Inc. for the noted 24'x16'x4' superstage; the approving resolution also references said stage.

Further, a resolution and proposal are being presented to the Village Council to approve a proposal from Sound Works Productions, Inc. for the provision of audio, lighting and generator equipment and technical support services to the Village – these services also pertain to the Village's September Ribfest event.

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE EXECUTION OF A STAGE CONTRACT FOR RIBFEST BETWEEN AMERICAN MOBILE STAGING, INC. <u>AND THE VILLAGE OF FOREST PARK</u>

WHEREAS, the Village of Forest Park ("Village") requires a certain 24'x16'x4' superstage for the Village Ribfest; and,

WHEREAS, American Mobile Staging, Inc. ("American") has previously provided such 24'x16'x4' superstage to the Village for Ribfest and desires to continue to provide to the Village such equipment; and,

Section 4. The officials, officers and employees of the Village are hereby authorized to take such further actions and execute such documents as are necessary to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution and the Contract.

Section 5. That Resolution R-56-21 adopted on July 12, 2021 is hereby repealed.

Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon its adoption.

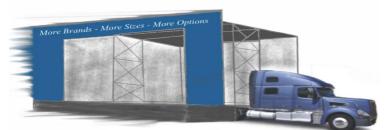

ORDINANCE O-____-21

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 33-5(M), ENTITLED "SUPPLEMENTAL PATIO (BEER GARDEN) LICENSE," OF CHAPTER 3, ENTITLED "LIQUOR CONTROL," OF TITLE 3, ENTITLED "BUSINESS AND LICENSE REGULATIONS " OF, THE VILLAGE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF FOREST PARK, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 4-1 of the Illinois Liquor Control Act of 1934 (235 ILCS 5/4-1), the corporate authorities of the Village of Forest Park, are expressly authorized to regulate and determine, by ordinance, the number, kind and classification of licenses, for sale at retail of alcoholic liquor not inconsistent with the Illinois Liquor Control Act and to establish further regulations and restrictions not inconsistent with law as the public good and convenience may require; and

WHEREAS, upon review of Title 3, Chapter 3, Section 3-3-5(M), entitled "Supplemental Patio (Beer Garden) License," the corporate authorities of the Village have determined that it is proper to amend Section 3-3-5(M) in the manner hereafter set forth.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND THE VILLAGE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF FOREST PARK, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 3-3-5(M), entitled "Supplemental Patio (Beer Garden) License," of Chapter 3, entitled "Liquor Control," of Title 3, entitled "Business and License Regulations," of the Village Code of Ordinances of the Village of Forest Park, as amended, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"M. Supplemental Patio (Beer Garden) License: The local liquor control commissioner may issue to holders of a class A, A1, A2, A3, A7 or C license, a supplemental patio license, which license shall permit the sale and/or consumption of alcoholic liquor in a patio area contiguous and adjacent to the licensed premises in which food is served under a restaurant license, where such use is permitted by the zoning ordinance of the village. The following conditions and restrictions shall apply to the issuance and validity of a supplemental patio license:

1. Alcoholic liquor may only be served or consumed in the patio area between the hours of eleven o'clock (11:00) A.M. and twelve o'clock (12:00) midnight on any day of the week.

2. No live entertainment or live music shall be permitted on the patio area of liquor licensed establishments located in the DBD – Downtown Business District.

3. The patio area shall be paved, screened and separated from the adjacent private or public property by a solid wood fence or appropriate structure or barrier acceptable to the village and not less than five feet (5') in height, and which shall be maintained in good and attractive condition.

4. Entrance to and exit from the patio area shall be through the licensed premises.

5. Permitted live music and live entertainment on the patios of liquor licensed establishments, other than the DBD – Downtown Business District, shall cease at eleven o'clock (11:00) p.m. on each day."

SECTION 2: That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage,

approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.

2. Renter shall vacate the riverboat(s) at the time(s) and date(s) indicated in this Permit Contract or be charged a pro-rated amount for every one-half (1/2) hour of overtime use.

Renter shall ensure that there is at least one adult supervisor fluent in English onboard at all times during Renter's use of the riverboat(s).
 District does not assume any liability for property damaged, lost or stolen on the District premises, or for personal injuries sustained on the premises during Renter's use of the riverboat(s). Renter hereby agrees to assume the full risk of any injuries, damages or loss, regardless of severity that the Renter may sustain as a result of this Contract. Renter further agrees to waive and release the District from any and all losses, claims, suits or judgments or damages that Renter might sustain as a result of any and all activities connected with or associated with this Contract.

5. Renter shall be responsible for and will pay for any damage to District property arising out of the use of the said riverboats(s) pursuant to this agreement.

6. Renter shall be responsible for inspecting the riverboat(s) subject to this Contract prior to each use and shall be responsible for bringing to the District's attention any potential dangers, safety hazards or problems. Renter is solely responsible for determining whether said riverboat(s) is safe,
