Issue Statement

Request for Village Council action related to the adoption of an Ordinance Amending Section 7-4-7 of the Village Code of the Village of Forest Park with Respect to Water and Sewer Rates and Charges

Background

The City of Chicago is the wholesale seller of Lake Michigan Water for the Village of Forest Park. Each year (since 2016), the cost of water sold to the Village by Chicago is adjusted based upon the January-January Consumer Price Index (CPI) rate, with 5% being the maximum adjustment. Since said figure exceeded 5% for the given time period, effective June 1, 2022, the cost of water supplied to Forest Park by Chicago will increase a sum of 5% pursuant to notice received by Forest Park from the City of Chicago.

The attached ordinance reflects the current water rates for the given categories as well as indicates the proposed rates for the respective categories effective June 1, 2022. Rates are proposed to increase 5% in light of the noted 5% Chicago increase. No changes are being proposed for the Village's sewer rates that are charged to water account consumers.

ORDINANCE NO. O- -22

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 7-4-7 OF THE VILLAGE CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF FOREST PARK WITH RESPECT TO WATER AND SEWER RATES AND CHARGES

WHEREAS, the Village of Forest Park ("Village") desires to amend the Village Code with respect to water and sewer rates and charges in light of notice received by the Village from the City of Chicago of its intent to raise its wholesale water rate five percent (5%) beginning on June 1, 2022.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Forest Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The recitals set forth in the preamble are hereby incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. That Section 7-4-7, entitled "Water and Sewer Rates and Charges," of Chapter 4, entitled "Water System Regulations," of Title 7, entitled "Public Ways and Property," of the Code of the Village of Forest Park is hereby amended as follows:

7-4-7: WATER AND SEWER RATES AND CHARGES:

A. Water Rates: The following rates for the Village's provision of water and sewer service are established for each one hundred (100) cubic feet of water transmitted, except industrial/commercial large meter customers, which rate is established for each one thousand (1,000) cubic feet of water transmitted, based upon meter readings:

Section 3. The corporate authorities of the City intend that this Ordinance will be made part of the City Code and that sections of this Ordinance can be renumbered or relettered and can be changed to "Section," "Article," Chapter" or some other appropriate word or phrase to accomplish codification, and typographical errors can be corrected with the authorization of the City Attorney, or his or her designee.

Section 4. All parts of the City Code in conflict with the terms or provisions of this Ordinance shall be and the same are hereby amended or repealed to the extent of such conflict, and said City Code and all other existing ordinances shall otherwise remain in full force and effect.

Section 5. If any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance or any part thereof is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional or invalid or ineffective by any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity or effectiveness of the remaining portions of this Ordinance, or any part thereof. The corporate authorities hereby declare that they would have passed each section, subsection, subdivision, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase thereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, subdivisions, paragraphs, sentences, clauses or phrases be declared unconstitutional, invalid or ineffective.

<u>Section 6</u>. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect upon its passage and approval as provided by law.

RE: Fund balance policy for Council approval

The Finance Department has worked with the Village auditors to develop a fund balance policy. A fund balance policy assists in providing financial stability, cash flow for operations, and the assurance that the Village will be able to respond to emergencies with fiscal strength. The policy must establish guidelines for the classification of fund balances in accordance with Governmental Accounting Standards Board Statement No. 54.

In the context of financial reporting, the term fund balance is used to describe the net position of governmental funds calculated in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP). GAAP financial statements report up to five separate categories of fund balance based on the type and source of constraints placed on how resources can be spent (presented in descending order from most constraining to least constraining):

- 1. Nonspendable fund balance inventories, land, prepaid items
- 2. Restricted fund balance external legal enforcement such as grants, tax levies, Federal or State programs
- 3. Committed fund balance balance designated for a specific purpose and restriction placed by Council through ordinance or resolution. Examples include future construction projects and capital expenditures
- 4. Assigned fund balance balance intended for a specific purpose and does not require formal action
- 5. Unassigned fund balance spendable fund balance that has not been categorized as restricted, committed, or assigned

The total of the amounts in these last three categories is termed unrestricted fund balance.

Adequate levels of fund balance should be maintained to mitigate current and future risks (e.g., revenue shortfalls and unanticipated expenditures). In most cases, discussions of fund balance will focus on the general fund. Financial resources available in other funds should also be considered in assessing the adequacy of unrestricted fund balance in the general fund.

In establishing a policy governing the level of unrestricted fund balance in the general fund, it is recommended to consider these factors:

- 1. The predictability of revenues and the volatility of expenditures
- 2. Exposure to significant one-time outlays (disasters, immediate capital needs, state budget cuts)
- 3. The potential drain upon general fund resources from other funds, as well as, the availability of resources in other funds
- 4. The potential impact on the entity's bond ratings and the corresponding increased cost of borrowed funds

At FY2021 year-end the General Fund balance was \$476,907; of this, nonspendable fund balance was \$428,723, restricted fund balance was \$621,776, and unassigned fund balance was a deficit of (\$573,592). No funds were committed or assigned. This is an improvement from FY2020 year-end unassigned balance of (\$1,596,384). This policy presented recommends no less than three months of current year budgeted expenditure as a target for unrestricted fund balance (committed, assigned, unassigned). Based upon FY2022 budgeted General Fund expenditures, the minimum unrestricted fund balance should be \$5,694,166. It is imperative that a corrective action plan be incorporated in future budget discussions to ensure fiscal stability.

At FY2021 year-end, the Village maintained twelve separate funds. Funds established for policy reasons should be reviewed periodically to determine whether those reasons remain valid. For example, a fund may be established to segregate revenue for a specific need. Once that need is met the separate fund should be abolished and the revenue should be deposited in the general fund.

As of FY2022, the Village will establish three additional restricted funds: Special Revenue Police DUI Fund with revenues restricted per Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/11-501.01); Capital Asset Fleet Replacement Fund with revenues assigned from the \$0.02 per gallon Municipal Motor Fuel Tax; and Capital Asset Police Vehicle Replacement Fund with revenues assigned from the Circuit Court of Cook County and a portion of tow fees. These funds will be effective upon passage of this policy.

RESOLUTION NO. R - - 22

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR AND ADOPTING A FUND BALANCE POLICY RELATING TO GOVERNMENTAL ACCOUNTING STANDARDS BOARD (GASB) STATEMENT NO. 54; AND, ESTABLISHING SPECIAL REVENUE AND CAPITAL ASSET FUNDS FOR THE VILLAGE OF FOREST PARK

WHEREAS, the Governmental Accounting Standards Board ("GASB") adopted Statement No. 54 "Fund Balance Reporting and Governmental Fund Type Definitions" effective for periods beginning after June 15, 2010. The objective of the Statement is to enhance the usefulness of fund balance information by providing clearer fund balance classifications and by clarifying governmental fund type definitions; and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Forest Park wishes to comply with GASB 54 as required and to adopt certain policies regarding fund balances; and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Forest Park wishes to establish a minimum required fund balance policy for the governmental funds, specifically the General Fund; and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Forest Park also wishes to establish three (3) new funds in addition to existing funds commencing FY2022: one (1) Special Revenue Fund to account for fines defined under the Illinois Driving While Under the Influence statute 625 ILCS 5/11-501; and, two (2) Capital Asset Funds (Fleet Replacement Fund and Police Vehicle Replacement Fund) to assign revenues and delineate the revenues and expenses from the General Fund operations.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Mayor and Village Council of the Village of Forest Park, Cook County, Illinois, as follows:

Section 1: The Village of Forest Park hereby adopts a Fund Balance Policy, a copy of which is attached as Exhibit "A."

Section 2: The Village Council authorizes the Finance Director to establish three (3) new funds: one (1) Special Revenue Fund to account for fines defined under the Illinois Driving While Under the Influence statute 625 ILCS 5/11-501; one (1) Fleet Replacement Capital Asset Fund; and, one (1) Police Vehicle Replacement Capital Asset Fund.

<u>Section 3</u>: This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon its adoption and approval, as provided by law.

VILLAGE OF FOREST PARK FUND BALANCE POLICY

Purpose

Fund balance, the difference between assets/deferred outflows and liabilities/deferred inflows in a governmental fund, is an important indicator of financial position. The purpose of this Policy is to establish guidelines for the classification of fund balances by the Village of Forest Park (the "Village") in accordance with GASB Statement No. 54. This Policy identifies funds of the Village that are restricted or committed for certain purposes in order to allow the public and the Village Council to better understand the constraints placed on the Village's fund balances. Unassigned fund balance is an important measure of economic stability. It is essential that the Village maintain adequate levels of unassigned fund balance to mitigate financial risk that can occur from unforeseen revenue fluctuations, unanticipated expenditures and similar circumstances. Credit rating agencies carefully monitor levels of fund balance in the General Fund to evaluate the Village's continued creditworthiness. The fund balance also provides cash flow liquidity for the Village's general operations.

Definitions

Governmental Funds

The fund balance will be composed of three primary categories:

- 1) Nonspendable Fund Balance portion of a Governmental Fund's fund balance that are not available to be spent, either in the short-term or long-term, or through legal restrictions (e.g., inventories, prepaid items, land held for resale and endowments).
- 2) Restricted Fund Balance portion of a Governmental Fund's fund balance that are subject to external enforceable legal restrictions (e.g., laws or regulations of other governments, grant awards, and property tax levies).
- 3) Unrestricted Fund Balance is made up of three components:
 - A) Committed Fund Balance the portion of a Governmental Fund's fund balance with self-imposed constraints or limitations that have been placed at the highest level of decision making through formal Council action. The same action is required to remove the commitment of fund balance.
 - B) Assigned Fund Balance the portion of a Governmental Fund's fund balance intended to be used by Council for specific purposes. Intent can be expressed by Council or by an official to which the Council delegates the authority. In governmental funds other than the general fund, assigned fund balance represents the amount that is not restricted or committed.
 - C) Unassigned Fund Balance the residual classification of the general fund and includes all amounts not contained in other classifications. Unassigned amounts are technically available for any purpose. In other governmental funds, the unassigned balance is used only to report a deficit balance resulting from overspending for specific purposes for which amounts had been restricted, committed, or assigned.

Some funds are funded by a variety of resources, including both restricted and unrestricted (committed, assigned and unassigned). The Council will follow GASB recommendation that the order of spending fund balance is as follows: restricted, committed, assigned, unassigned.

Definitions – Continued

Proprietary Funds

Proprietary funds include enterprise and internal service funds. The net assets will be composed of three primary categories:

- 1) Invested in Capital Assets, Net of Related Debt portion of a Proprietary Fund's net assets that reflects the fund's net investment in capital assets less any amount of outstanding debt related to the purchase/acquisition of said capital assets. Related debt, for this purpose, includes the outstanding balances of any bonds, mortgages, notes, or other borrowings that are attributable to the acquisition, construction, or improvement of capital assets of the Village.
- 2) Restricted Net Assets portion of a Proprietary Fund's net assets that are subject to external enforceable legal restrictions (e.g., grantor, contributor and bond covenants).
- 3) Unrestricted Net Assets portion of a Proprietary Fund's net assets that is neither restricted nor invested in capital assets (net of related debt).

Authority

Governmental Funds

The responsibility for designating funds to specific classifications shall be as follows:

Committed Fund Balance – A self-imposed constraint on spending the fund balance must be approved by ordinance or resolution. Any modifications or removal of the self-imposed constraint must use the same action used to commit the fund balance. Formal action to commit fund balance must occur before the end of the fiscal year. The dollar amount of the commitment can be determined after year end. The Village Council is the Village's highest level of decision-making authority, and the formal action that is required to be taken to establish, modify, or rescind a fund balance commitment is an ordinance or resolution approved by the Council.

Assigned Fund Balance – A self-imposed constraint on spending the fund balance based on the Council's intent to use fund balance for a specific purpose. The authority may be delegated to members of the management team by the Village Council.

Minimum Unrestricted Fund Balance Levels

Governmental Funds

The following definitions will be used in reporting activity in governmental funds. The Village may or may not report all fund types in any given reporting period based on actual circumstances and activity.

General Fund

Purpose - A major fund and the general operating fund of the Village. It is used to account for all activities that are not accounted for in another fund.

Fund Balance - Unrestricted fund balance targets should represent no less than three months and no more than six months of current year budgeted expenditures. Balances above the maximum are considered a surplus and will be used for one-time expenditures or transferred to other funds or to capital projects at the Council's discretion.

Minimum Unrestricted Fund Balance Levels - Continued

Special Revenue Fund

Purpose - Used to account for and report the proceeds of specific revenue sources that are legally restricted or committed to expenditures for specified purposes other than debt service or capital projects. The revenue source must be a substantial portion of the fund's resource on an ongoing basis.

Financing – Special revenue funds are provided by a specific annual property tax levy or other restricted and/or committed revenue source. Financing may also be received from other charges for services, etc.

Fund Balance – Derived from property taxes and other restricted revenue sources; therefore, legally restricted. The portion of fund balance derived from property taxes will be legally restricted, and therefore spent first. The remaining fund balance amount (restricted and/or committed) will be targeted at a minimum level of 25% of current year budgeted expenditures. This will be adjusted annually with the adoption of the annual budget and is calculated at a minimum of three months of expenditures not including capital, debt service and transfers.

Debt service Fund

Purpose - Established to account for financial resources that are restricted, committed, or assigned to expenditure for payment of general long term debt principal and interest.

Financing – The municipality levies an amount or transfers in an amount close to the principal and interest that is anticipated to be paid.

Fund Balance –Derived from property taxes; therefore, legally restricted. Any fund balance accumulation should be a maximum the amount of the next principal and interest payment due.

Capital Projects Fund

Purpose - Established to account for and report financial resources that are restricted, committed, or assigned to expenditure for capital outlays including the acquisition or construction of capital facilities and other capital assets, excluding those types of capital related outflows financed by proprietary funds.

Financing – Debt financing, grants, or interfund transfers are used to finance projects.

Fund Balance – Considered segregated for maintenance, construction and/or development; therefore, considered committed, restricted, or assigned depending on the intended source/use of the funds.

Minimum Unrestricted Fund Balance Levels - Continued Proprietary Funds

Enterprise Fund

Purpose - Established to account for and report financial resources that are invested in capital assets, net of related debt, restricted, or unrestricted for future spending related to the fund. The focus of enterprise fund measurement is upon determination of operating income, changes in net assets, financial position, and cash flows. The generally accepted accounting principles applicable are those similar to businesses in the private sector. Enterprise funds are required to account for operations for which a fee is charged to external users for goods or services and the activity (a) is financed with debt that is solely secured by a pledge of the net revenues, (b) has third party requirements that the cost of providing services, including capital costs, be recovered with fees and charges or (c) establishes fees and charges based on a pricing policy designed to recover similar costs.

Financing – User fees, debt financing, or grants are used to finance operations, capital outlay and improvements, and debt service retirements.

Net Assets – Considered invested in capital assets net of related debt (for amounts capitalized as capital assets, less the outstanding debt related to the acquisition of said assets). Restricted net assets relate to bond covenant reserves as outlined in the bond ordinance. Unrestricted net asset targets should represent no less than three months of current year budgeted expenses (excluding debt service and capitalized asset expenses).

Other Considerations

In establishing the above policies for unrestricted fund balance/net asset levels, the following factors were considered:

- The predictability of the Village's revenues and the volatility of its expenditures (i.e., higher levels of unrestricted fund balance may be needed if significant revenue sources are subject to unpredictable fluctuations or if operating expenditures are highly volatile)
- The Village's perceived exposure to significant one-time outlays (e.g., disasters, immediate capital needs, state budget cuts)
- The potential drain upon General Fund resources from other funds as well as the availability of resources in other funds (i.e., deficits in other funds may require a higher level of unrestricted fund balance be maintained in the General Fund, just as, the availability of resources in other funds may reduce the amount of unrestricted fund balance needed in the General Fund)
- Liquidity (i.e., a disparity between when financial resources actually become available to make payments and the average maturity of related liabilities may require that a higher level of resources be maintained)
- Commitments and assignments (i.e., governments may wish to maintain higher levels of unrestricted fund balance to compensate for any portion of unrestricted fund balance already committed or assigned by the government for a specific purpose)

If any of the above factors change, the Village will readdress current unrestricted fund balance/net asset levels to ensure amounts are appropriate.

Issue Statement

Request for Village Council action related to the adoption of a Resolution Approving the Specifications and Authorizing the Advertising of Bids for the Village of Forest Park 15th Street Sewer Separation CDBG Project (Circle Avenue to Marengo Avenue).

Background

In 2020, the Village filed a Community Development Block Grant (CDGB) application with Cook County for a sewer separation project along 15th Street between Circle and Marengo. This project is an extension of the Village's efforts to separate stormwater and wastewater collection facilities in said area; a mainline stormwater collection sewer was installed along Circle Avenue in 2020. This 15th Street project is the first of many planned extensions (pending available funding) of stormwater collection facilities that will eventually feed into the recently installed Circle mainline; such efforts increase the volume of stormwater collection capacity in said area while minimizing flooding impacts.

The estimated cost of this stormwater sewer extension/separation project amounts to \$377,000; \$360,000 of which will be paid for by the CDBG grant. The Village's project share portion amounts to \$40,000; said sum includes Phase III engineering expenses.

It also must be noted that in early 2022, the Village had applied for 2023 CDBG funding to further extend this stormwater sewer extension/separation further east along 15th Street – from Marengo to Elgin. The Village will find out either in second or third quarter 2022 if it will receive funding for this future project.

- WITH A NEW OR DIFFERENT FRAME AND LID SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE CONTRACTOR.
- ANY EXISTING OR PROPOSED SEWER DAMAGED BY THE CONSTRUCTOR DURING CONSTRUCTION SHALL BE REPLACED BY THE CONTRACTOR TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE ENGINEER AT NO COST TO THE OWNER.
- THE CONTRACTOR SHALL RECEIVE NO ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION FOR CONSTRUCTION STAGING NECESSARY TO ACCOMMODATE UTILITY RELOCATION OR ADJUSTMENT AND/OR FOR DELAYS CAUSED BY UTILITY RELOCATION OR ADJUSTMENT.

HE SHALL BE PREPARED AT ALL TIMES TO DISPOSE OF THE WATER RECEIVED FROM TEMPORARY CONNECTIONS UNTIL SUCH TIME AS THE PERMANENT CONNECTIONS WITH SEWERS ARE BUILT AND IN SERVICE. THIS WORK WILL NOT BE PAID FOR SEPARATELY, BUT SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE CONTRACT.
- ALL ABANDONED PIPE AND STRUCTURE INVERTS SHALL BE PLUGGED WITH BRICK AND MORTAR TO THE SATISFACTION OF THE ENGINEER. THIS WORK SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE COST OF THE STORM OR SANITARY SEWER ITEMS BEING REMOVED.
- THE CONTRACTOR SHALL DETERMINE WHEN FLAT SLAB TOPS ARE REQUIRED ON MANHOLES. NO ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION SHALL BE ALLOWED FOR THE USE OF FLAT SLAB TOPS.
- RIM ELEVATIONS GIVEN ON THE PLANS ARE ONLY TO ASSIST THE CONTRACTOR IN DETERMINING THE APPROXIMATE OVERALL HEIGHT OF THE STRUCTURE. FRAMES OF ALL NEW, ADJUSTED OR RECONSTRUCTED STRUCTURES WILL BE ADJUSTED TO THE FINAL ELEVATION OF THE AREA IN WHICH THEY ARE LOCATED AS PART OF THE STRUCTURE, ADJUSTMENT OR RECONSTRUCTION COST.
- IN THE EVENT THAT TRAFFIC CANNOT BE MAINTAINED, STEEL PLATES MAY BE USED TO COVER OPEN TRENCHES.
- ADJUST MANHOLE OR VAULT RIM ELEVATIONS TO FINAL GRADE AT TIME OF FINAL PAVING OR LANDSCAPING. ADJUSTMENT OF NEW STRUCTURES TO FINAL GRADE IS INCLUDED IN THE COST OF THE NEW STRUCTURE REGARDLESS OF THE AMOUNT OF TIMES THE ADJUSTMENT MUST BE MADE.
- 8. COMPLY WITH THE METROPOLITAN WATER RECLAMATION DISTRICT (MWRD) MINIMUM PROJECT AND MANHOLE STRUCTURE REQUIREMENTS.
- ALL TRENCH BACKFILL QUANTITIES FOR STORM AND SANITARY SEWER AND WATER MAIN HAVE BEEN COMPUTED AND SHALL BE PAID FOR IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE IDOT DIVISION OF HIGHWAYS BUREAU OF CONSTRUCTION TRENCH BACKFILL TABLE, BASED ON THE INVERT DEPTH FROM PROPOSED PAVEMENT.
- 10. ANY TRENCH BACKFILL REQUIRED IN EXCESS OF THE QUANTITY ESTABLISHED IN THE TRENCH BACKFILL TABLE, INCLUDING BEDDING MATERIAL, SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE COST OF THE ITEM BEING INSTALLED.
- 11. WATER MAIN-QUALITY SEWERS IDENTIFIED ON THE PLANS AS BEING PVC SHALL BE PER ASTM D-2241 WITH JOINTS ASTM
- 12. CONTRACTOR SHALL BE SOLELY RESPONSIBLE FOR ALL TRENCH BRACING/SHORING AND PUMPING/DEWATERING NECESSARY TO COMPLETE THE IMPROVEMENTS. THIS WORK SHALL BE INCLUDED IN THE BID PRICE FOR THE VARIOUS SEWER INSTALLATION ITEMS. NO ADDITIONAL PAYMENT OF TRENCH BACKFILL SHALL BE MADE FOR CAVE-INS AND OTHER INCIDENTS RESULTING FROM GRANULAR SOILS.
- 13. ALL SANITARY MANHOLES (AND STORM MANHOLES CONNECTED TO COMBINED SEWERS) SHALL HAVE PRECAST "RUBBER BOOTS" THAT CONFORM TO ASTM C-923 FOR ALL PIPE CONNECTIONS. PRECAST SECTIONS SHALL CONSIST OF MODIFIED GROOVE TONGUE AND RUBBER GASKET TYPE JOINTS.

WATER MAIN AND SERVICES

- FOR WATER MAIN SHUT OFFS, THE CONTRACTOR SHALL GIVE THE VILLAGE A MINIMUM OF 48 HOURS' NOTICE. THE VILLAGE SHALL PROVIDE NOTIFICATION FORMS AND DETERMINE THE LIMIT OF THE AFFECTED AREAS. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR DISTRIBUTION OF THE NOTIFICATION FORMS TO ALL AFFECTED RESIDENTS.
- THE CONTRACTOR SHALL NOT OPEN OR SHUT ANY WATER VALVES OR FIRE HYDRANTS WITHOUT PRIOR AUTHORIZATION FROM THE VILLAGE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT. UNAUTHORIZED USE SHALL SUBJECT THE OFFENDER TO ARREST AND

MISCELLANEOUS

- THE CONTRACTOR SHALL SAW CUT PAVEMENT, CURB & GUTTER, AND SIDEWALK AS INDICATED ON THE PLANS TO SEPARATE THE EXISTING MATERIAL TO BE REMOVED BY MEANS OF AN APPROVED CONCRETE SAW TO A DEPTH AS SHOWN ON THE PLANS OR AS DIRECTED BY THE ENGINEER. THIS WORK SHALL BE CONSIDERED INCLUDED IN THE COST OF THE ITEM BEING REMOVED.

CONSTRUCTION OF NEW FACILITIES OF THIS TYPE IS PROHIBITED; AND ALL EXISTING DRAIN TILES AND PERFORATED PIPES ENCOUNTERED WITHIN THE PROJECT AREA SHALL BE PLUGGED OR REMOVED, AND SHALL NOT BE CONNECTED TO COMBINED SEWERS, SANITARY SEWERS, OR STORM SEWERS TRIBUTARY TO COMBINED SEWERS.
- 18. A BACKFLOW PREVENTER IS REQUIRED FOR ALL DETENTION BASINS TRIBUTARY TO COMBINED SEWERS. REQUIRED BACKFLOW PREVENTERS SHALL BE INSPECTED AND EXERCISED ANNUALLY BY THE PROPERTY OWNER TO ENSURE PROPER OPERATION, AND ANY NECESSARY MAINTENANCES SHALL BE PERFORMED TO ENSURE FUNCTIONALITY. IN THE EVENT OF A SEWER SURCHARGE INTO AN OPEN DETENTION BASIN TRIBUTARY TO COMBINED SEWERS, THE PERMITTEE SHALL ENSURE THAT CLEAN UP AND WASH OUT OF SEWAGE TAKES PLACE WITHIN 48 HOURS OF THE STORM EVENT.

- E. EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL
- 1. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL INSTALL THE EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL DEVICES AS SHOWN ON THE APPROVED EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL PLAN.
- 2. EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL PRACTICES SHALL BE FUNCTIONAL PRIOR TO HYDROLOGIC DISTURBANCE OF THE SITE.
- 3. ALL DESIGN CRITERIA, SPECIFICATIONS, AND INSTALLATION OF EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL PRACTICES SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ILLINOIS URBAN MANUAL.
- 4. A COPY OF THE APPROVED EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL PLAN SHALL BE MAINTAINED ON THE SITE AT ALL TIMES.
- 5. INSPECTIONS AND DOCUMENTATION SHALL BE PERFORMED, AT A MINIMUM: a) UPON COMPLETION OF INITIAL EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL MEASURES, PRIOR TO ANY SOIL DISTURBANCE.
- b) ONCE EVERY SEVEN (7) CALENDAR DAYS AND WITHIN 24 HOURS OF THE END OF A STORM EVENT WITH GREATER THAN 0.5 INCH OF RAINFALL OR LIQUID EQUIVALENT PRECIPITATION.
- 6. SOIL DISTURBANCE SHALL BE CONDUCTED IN SUCH A MANNER AS TO MINIMIZE EROSION. IF STRIPPING, CLEARING, GRADING, OR LANDSCAPING ARE TO BE DONE IN PHASES, THE CO-PERMITTEE SHALL PLAN FOR APPROPRIATE SOIL EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL MEASURES
- 7. A STABILIZED MAT OF CRUSHED STONE MEETING THE STANDARDS OF THE ILLINOIS URBAN MANUAL SHALL BE INSTALLED AT ANY POINT WHERE TRAFFIC WILL BE ENTERING OR LEAVING A CONSTRUCTION SITE. SEDIMENT OR SOIL REACHING AN IMPROVED PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY, STREET, ALLEY OR PARKING AREA SHALL BE REMOVED BY SCRAPING OR STREET CLEANING AS ACCUMULATIONS WARRANT AND TRANSPORTED TO A CONTROLLED SEDIMENT DISPOSAL AREA.
- 8. CONCRETE WASHOUT FACILITIES SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE ILLINOIS URBAN MANUAL AND SHALL BE INSTALLED PRIOR TO ANY ON SITE CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES INVOLVING CONCRETE.
- 9. MORTAR WASHOUT FACILITIES SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED IN ADDITION TO CONCRETE WASHOUT FACILITIES FOR ANY BRICK AND MORTAR BUILDING ENVELOPE CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES.
- 10. TEMPORARY DIVERSIONS SHALL BE CONSTRUCTED AS NECESSARY TO DIRECT ALL RUNOFF FROM HYDROLOGICALLY DISTURBED AREAS TO AN APPROPRIATE SEDIMENT TRAP OR BASIN. VOLUME CONTROL FACILITIES SHALL NOT BE USED AS TEMPORARY SEDIMENT BASINS.
- 11. DISTURBED AREAS OF THE SITE WHERE CONSTRUCTION ACTIVITIES HAVE TEMPORARILY OR PERMANENTLY CEASED SHALL BE STABILIZED WITH TEMPORARY OR PERMANENT MEASURES WITHIN SEVEN (7) DAYS.
- 12. ALL FLOOD PROTECTION AREAS AND VOLUME CONTROL FACILITIES SHALL, AT A MINIMUM, BE PROTECTED WITH A DOUBLE-ROW OF SILT FENCE (OR EQUIVALENT).
- 13. VOLUME CONTROL FACILITIES SHALL NOT BE CONSTRUCTED UNTIL ALL OF THE CONTRIBUTING DRAINAGE AREA HAS BEEN STABILIZED.
- 14. SOIL STOCKPILES SHALL, AT A MINIMUM, BE PROTECTED WITH PERIMETER SEDIMENT CONTROLS. SOIL STOCKPILES SHALL NOT BE PLACED IN FLOOD PROTECTION AREAS OR THEIR BUFFERS.
- 15. EARTHEN EMBANKMENT SIDE SLOPES SHALL BE STABILIZED WITH APPROPRIATE EROSION CONTROL BLANKET.
- 16. STORM SEWERS THAT ARE OR WILL BE FUNCTIONING DURING CONSTRUCTION SHALL BE PROTECTED BY APPROPRIATE SEDIMENT CONTROL MEASURES.
- 17. THE CONTRACTOR SHALL EITHER REMOVE OR REPLACE ANY EXISTING DRAIN TILES AND INCORPORATE THEM INTO THE DRAINAGE PLAN FOR THE DEVELOPMENT. DRAIN TILES CANNOT BE TRIBUTARY TO A SANITARY OR COMBINED SEWER. DRAIN TILES ALLOWED IN COMBINED SEWER AREA FOR GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE PRACTICES.
- 18. IF DEWATERING SERVICES ARE USED, ADJOINING PROPERTIES AND DISCHARGE LOCATIONS SHALL BE PROTECTED FROM EROSION AND SEDIMENTATION. DEWATERING SYSTEMS SHOULD BE INSPECTED DAILY DURING OPERATIONAL PERIODS. THE SITE INSPECTOR MUST BE PRESENT AT THE COMMENCEMENT OF DEWATERING ACTIVITIES.
- 19. THE CONTRCTOR SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR TRENCH DEWATERING AND EXCAVATION FOR THE INSTALLATION OF SANITARY SEWERS, STORM SEWERS, WATERMAINS AS WELL AS THEIR SERVICES AND OTHER APPURTENANCES. ANY TRENCH DEWATERING, WHICH CONTAINS SEDIMENT SHALL PASS THROUGH A SEDIMENT SETTLING POND OR EQUALLY EFFÉCTIVE SEDIMENT CONTROL DEVICE. ALTERNATIVES MAY INCLUDE DEWATERING INTO A SUMP PIT, FILTER BAG OR EXISTING VEGETATED UPSLOPE AREA. SEDIMENT LADEN WATERS SHALL NOT BE DISCHARGE TO WATERWAYS, FLOOD PROTECTION AREAS OR THE COMBINED SEWER SYSTEM.
- 20. ALL PERMANENT EROSION CONTROL PRACTICES SHALL BE INITIATED WITHIN SEVEN (7) DAYS FOLLOWING THE COMPLETION OF SOIL DISTURBING ACTIVITIES.
- 21. ALL EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL MEASURES SHALL BE MAINTAINED AND REPAIRED AS NEEDED ON A YEAR-ROUND BASIS DURING CONSTRUCTION AND ANY PERIODS OF CONSTRUCTION SHUTDOWN UNTIL PERMANENT STABILIZATION IS ACHIEVED.
- 22. ALL TEMPORARY EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL MEASURES SHALL BE REMOVED WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS AFTER PERMANENT SITE STABILIZATION.
- 23. THE EROSION AND SEDIMENT CONTROL MEASURES SHOWN ON THE PLANS ARE THE MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS. ADDITIONAL MEASURES MAY BE REQUIRED, AS DIRECTED BY THE ENGINEER, SITE INSPECTOR, OR MWRD.
