Administrator Amidei acknowledged all of the planning and coordination of work involved with the shut down of Des Plaines Avenue in order to tap the water main for Wilcox before IDOT completes the repaving of Des Plaines.

## **COMMISSIONER'S REPORTS:**

Commissioner Byrnes expressed his appreciation to the residents, department heads and employees of the village at the close of his 8-year term as Commissioner.

Commissioner Maxham reported that the village is hosting a Mental Health Fair on May 6<sup>th</sup>, in collaboration with the Proviso Mental Health Commission. All are welcome. The Altenheim Steering Committee will present their recommendation for the future of the site. Last, the commissioner thanked Commissioner Byrnes for serving as a Village Commissioner.

Commissioner Nero asked drivers to slow down, and be more careful during IDOT's roadwork on Des Plaines to protect the road workers and thanked Commissioner Byrnes for his leadership, guidance and friendship.

Commissioner Voogd reported that she attended the IML lobby day in Springfield and attended a hearing about bringing the LGDF share to the local municipalities back to the 2011 level of 10%. Arbor Day will be celebrated on Friday, April 28, at 9:00 with the planting of a tree at the Library. Also, the Dog Park Grand Opening is being held on April 29<sup>th</sup> at 11:00. Last, the commissioner thanked all of the volunteers and Commissioner Byrnes for his service to the village.

Mayor Hoskins reported that 3/5ths of the Council was in Springfield last week pressing for changes to the LGDF distribution. The mayor is also lobbying, along with the CTA, to obtain \$2,000,000 for the CTA to help with expenses related to unhoused persons along the blue and green lines. The Fire Department was helpful in providing statistics and justifying the costs for the request for reimbursement. The Regional Enterprise Zone is exploring and considering expanding into Forest Park. Last, Mayor Hoskins thanked Commissioner Joe Byrnes for his service to the village and his friendship and guidance.

There being no further business to be addressed, Commissioner Byrnes moved and Commissioner Nero seconded to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried unanimously.

### **RESOLUTION HONORING JOSEPH BYRNES UPON THE CONCLUSION OF HIS TERM FROM ELECTED OFFICE IN THE VILLAGE OF FOREST PARK, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS**

**WHEREAS**, Joseph Byrnes was first elected Commissioner of the Village of Forest Park, Cook County, Illinois, on April 7, 2015, and accepted the responsibilities of the Department of Accounts and Finance; and

**WHEREAS**, as the Commissioner of Accounts and Finance, Joseph acted as the Vice President of the Village Council and he was charged with overseeing the finances of the Village, the operations of the Fire Department, and the operations of the Village Clerk's Office; and

**WHEREAS**, Commissioner Byrnes was reelected on April 2, 2019, and accepted the responsibilities of the Department of Public Health and Safety, having jurisdiction and supervision over the building department, the code enforcement department, and all the inspectors charged with enforcing village health, safety, zoning and building codes; and

**WHEREAS**, Commissioner Byrnes on July 16, 2021, once again accepted the responsibilities of the Department of Accounts and Finance, overseeing the finances of the Village, the operations of the Fire Department, and the operations of the Village Clerk's Office and acted as the Vice President of the Village Council; and

**WHEREAS**, Commissioner Byrnes was instrumental in the establishment of a fleet fund - putting forth a financial plan to service and maintain the village's vehicles as well as created a vehicle replacement plan; and, encouraged strong fiscal management with the creation of a fund balance policy to ensure stable service delivery, meet future needs and protect against financial instability; and

**WHEREAS**, Commissioner Byrnes helped guide contract negotiations with employee unions, supporting fair bargaining and pay equity adjustments for Village employees; and, helped the Fire Department return to the use of in-house paramedic-firefighters; and

**WHEREAS**, Commissioner Byrnes was also influential in helping to garner millions of dollars in State and Federal grants supporting a number of projects over his eight-year tenure; and under his leadership and in conjunction with council action, the Village benefitted from a thorough streetscape reconstruction along both Roosevelt Road and Madison Street west of Des Plaines Avenue; the demolition of several dilapidated buildings located near the Altenheim Residences; adding street cameras and license plate readers to Village streets to aid the Police Department in protecting the community; and, the re-painting of the north and south water towers; and

**WHEREAS**, during a global COVID-19 pandemic, Commissioner Byrnes was instrumental in keeping the village within its fiscal means, encouraging conservative spending during the pandemic; supporting employee safety precautions including supplying masks and COVID-19 vaccinations; helped facilitate collaboration between Local, County and State offices to bring a Department of Health COVID-19 Vaccination site to Forest Park making vaccinations easily accessible to residents; and

**WHEREAS**, over the years many decisions occurred, small and large, that affected the quality of life for both the residents and the business community of Forest Park; advocated for the separation of the Village's combined sewer systems, helping to alleviate the flooding of basements during heavy storms; reconstructed countless miles of new alleys and streets; supported green initiatives including green alleys, electric vehicle charging stations, and the single-use plastic foodware ordinance; and, supported the re-engagement of the Village's Environmental Control Commission, the Board of Health, the Diversity Commission and the Youth Commission; and

**WHEREAS**, Commissioner Byrnes served in the U.S. Airforce from 1965 to 1973, where he served two tours in Vietnam and received a Purple Heart for his bravery for assisting injured fellow soldiers to flee to safety while he himself was injured; and

**WHEREAS**, Commissioner Byrnes served as a Forest Park Police Officer from January 15, 1974 until his day of retirement on July 20, 1999 as Deputy Chief, serving the Forest Park Police Department for over 25 years; he also served as a Park District of Forest Park Commissioner from 2001 to 2007 where he was instrumental in rebuilding the soccer field, adding a spray park to the Aquatic Center and renovating the baseball fields; he now serves as a Park District Ambassador; and

**WHEREAS**, on a personal level, Commissioner Byrnes has been an active volunteer, helping the Chamber of Commerce with many events; working the grill at the Park District's Annual No Glove Softball Tournament; flipping pancakes, burgers and more for St. Bernardine School and Church; and

**WHEREAS**, Commissioner Byrnes has been a dedicated public servant having conducted himself in a professional manner, earning the respect of those with whom he has served, and those he has been entrusted to serve, contributing to the betterment of his Office and the community as a whole - Commissioner Byrnes' dedication to his duties as an elected official in the Village of Forest Park is an inspiration.

#### Issue Statement

Request for Village Council action: approval of specifications (1-8A-4) related to the solicitation of proposals from masonry contractors to repair the brick wall at the Village's pump station located at Hannah Avenue and I-290.

#### Background

The Village of Forest Park has two pump stations that feed water to its water connections and to two 500,000-gallon water towers. The water comes from the City of Chicago through a water main that runs down Jackson Boulevard from Austin Avenue in Oak Park, and then dumps into a reservoir at each pump station. The station at Jackson Boulevard and Des Plaines Avenue holds 1 million gallons of water and the station at Hannah Avenue and I-290 holds 350,000 gallons of water. These stations were built in the late 1960's. In the mid-1980's the Brookfield - North Riverside Water Commission approached the Village to share the reservoir at Hannah Avenue and I-290. They agreed to bring in a new water main from Jackson Boulevard and into the Hannah Avenue pump station. They would then build an extension to the Village's existing pump station to house the new intake pipe, their pumps and the SCADA system. When they built the extension to the building, they used the existing out house to house the new intake pipe and then built around it. The brick work on the old out house has since drastically deteriorated and is in dire need of repair. It will need layers of brick replaced and mortared in place. This work will be in excess of \$10,000 and the Village's Public Works Director is asking for approval to get proposals to have the work completed.
